This artwork is based on Antonio Vivaldi's 4 Seasons concertos composed in the early 1700s in Italy. Each Concerto comprises three movements.

If on, the Press of the Green button will light up and play a fragment from each of Vivaldi's concertos based on the artist's cover music.

The orchestra performance of the entire 4 seasons concertos lasts 40 minutes or more.

This artist's cover music version of Vivaldi's 4 Seasons is about 1 minute.

Spring in E major RV269 First Movement Allegro ≈ 18 seconds

Summer in G minor RV315 Third Movement Presto ≈ 10 seconds

Fall in F major RV293 First Movement Allegro ≈ 14 seconds

Winter in F minor First Movement Allegro non molto ≈ 16 seconds
